PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hi everyone,

I hope you are in good spirits this holiday season. We were able to do a lot of cleaning at the temple and Lotus Adult Day Care Center in preparation for the New Year. Thank you to everyone who came out to temple beautification on December 13th.

We have a few other events around the New Year, starting with our annual Mochi-tsuki at 8 am on Sunday, December 27, 2015. This is an event for family and friends. The community is invited to participate as we "pregrind" the mochi before placing it in the *usu* (stone mortar). This shortens the pounding time and allows everyone, young and old to participate. It is a fun day for everyone. I enjoy seeing the young ones fold and shape the mochi—also see the cornstarch on their faces! I hope you had a chance to participate. If not, plan on it next year.

Recently one of our newer members asked me a question. She asked me what I would say to her husband if he asked, "what is the value of membership in Aiea Hongwanji"? I could have answered in several ways: 1) learn about Buddhist teachings and philosophy at our services or via other related venues, 2) make friends and enjoy fellowship on Thursdays and Sundays, 3) join one of our groups such as BWA, Sr. YBA or Jr. YBA, 4) gain self-satisfaction by working to maintain our temple and grounds, or 5) supporting the temple in any way helps to share Buddhist teachings with our community and the world. All of these, I think, are good reasons to join AHM.

I chose to answer this way: he would be joining an organization that promotes peace in the world. I explained that the message of peace is delivered by all of the leaders in our organization. Examples are the statement by His Eminence Monshu Kojun Ohtani in last month's JIKO and also comments by our Bishop Eric Matsumoto on many occasions. Buddhist teaching tries to develop peace that starts with each individual and extends to the community. You've heard the statement "peace begins within". The mission statement of the Pacific Buddhist Academy is: To prepare students for college through academic excellence; to enrich their lives with Buddhist values; and to develop their courage to nurture peace. THE ACCESSION CEREMONY (DENTO HOKOKU HOYO). The Accession Ceremony (Commemoration on the Accession of the Jodo Shinshu Tradition) will be held from Oct 2016 through May 2017 at Honzan in Kyoto, Japan.

The Accession Ceremony is conducted before Amida Tathagata and Shinran Shonin to formally announce that the newly-inducted Head Priest shall take on the responsibilities as Monshu, following in the footsteps of his predecessors to spread the Dharma to new generations and embracing the opportunity to spread the Nembutsu teaching to a greater number of people. It is also a festive occasion welcoming everyone to celebrate the inauguration of the new Monshu.

Honzan designated October 21, 2016 and March 31, 2017 for the Overseas Districts (BCA, Canada, and Hawaii). HQ is now coordinating two special tours for ministers, members and affiliates of HHMH to attend the Dento Hokoku Hoyo. 




